

RESOLUTION 1

A Resolution in Opposition to any Mandatory Vaccine Policies

WHEREAS, The Constitutions of both the United States and the State of Washington guarantee the right of citizens to be secure in their person and property;

WHEREAS, Under the HIPAA guidelines an individual's medical records are private and strictly confidential and should not be available for use by external agencies without one's permission and therefore used against them; and

WHEREAS, Neither Washington State's legislative or executive branch should control, mandate or enforce an individual's medical decisions;

RESOLVED, That the members of the Washington Federation of Republican Women, meeting at its Fall Board of Directors meeting in Southcenter, WA, October 15 and 16, 2021, contest the requirement of mandatory vaccinations as a condition of employment, education, travel, medical services, community, or public interchange or to be eligible for any public services; and

RESOLVED, that the Washington Federation of Republican Women, shall convey this resolution to the Washington State Governor, and to Washington State House and Senate leaders.
